

We invite you to sign up for **KIDS ON DECK**, our summer baseball camp for boys & girls of all ages and skill levels.

These are week-long camps with topnotch instructors, including some of our Hall-of-Famers (i.e. Fergie Jenkins and Jim Fanning) as well as former Blue Jay and Expo Players and players from Canada's men's and women's **National Teams.**



- Individual and group instruction with appropriate ratios of instructors/chaperones to children.
- Nutritious food & quality accommodation.
- Priority given to safety & security
- Focus on baseball FUNdamentals. We are strong believers in positive reinforcement.
- In addition to the baseball element, swimming and other sports activities are included, as well as a bus trip to Rogers Centre. Museum activities are incorporated, as well as programming related to social justice and cultural awareness.
- Players from across Canada are welcome, and airport pick-ups can be arranged. The participants are dropped off on a Sunday afternoon and picked up the following Saturday morning.
- A "day-rate" option is available to local families who wish to drop off their child(ren) each morning and pick up at the end of each day, although this will result in those girls & boys missing out on the evening activities.
